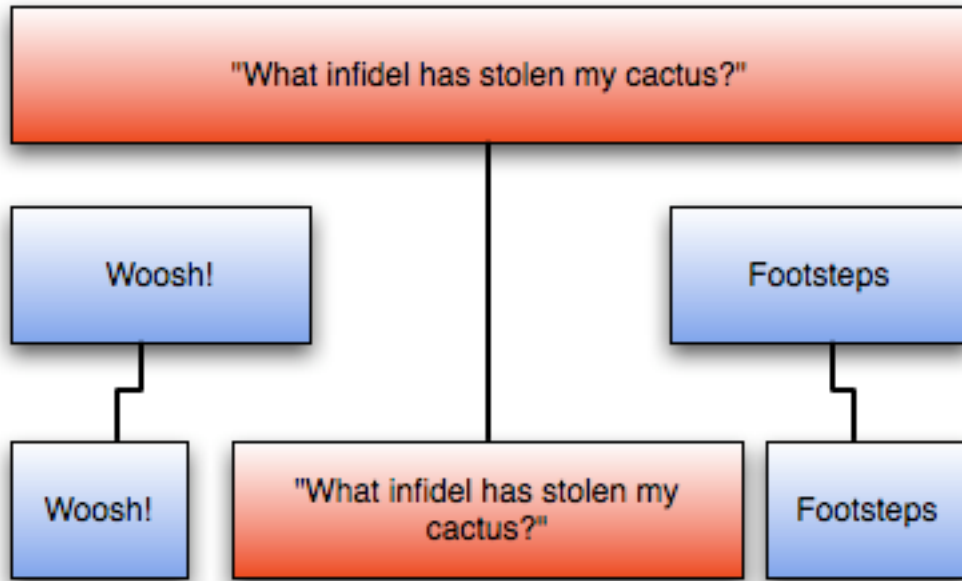


Internet Radio Project Tutorial:
Inserting audio effects into a production



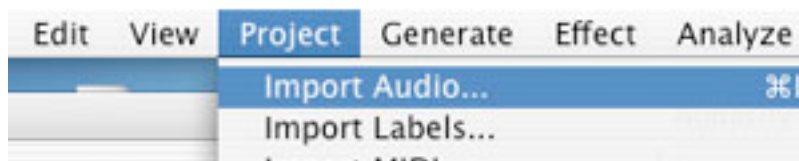
Given the raw voice-audio clip “What infidel has stolen my cactus!?!”, let’s make it a bit more intriguing by adding a “Woosh” and some running footsteps. The schematic above illustrates how we will integrate these three separate pieces of audio.

Step 1: Record and download the appropriate audio

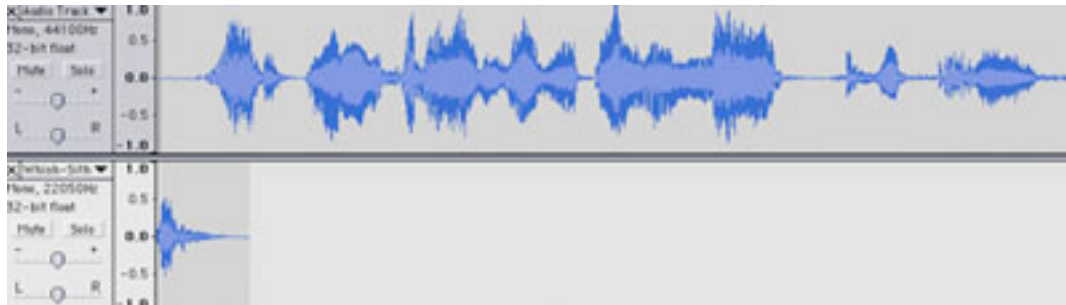
Record, find and download the audio you will need for your piece. Audio effects can be easily found at www.findsounds.com or www.flashkit.com, two of many popular audio sites.

Step 2: Import audio into your main recording

Open your main recording in Audacity. Then, select the Track >> Import Audio menu option.

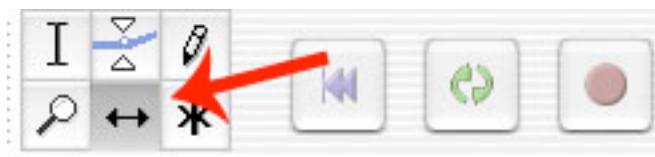


Imported audio will appear as a new track, as pictured below:



Step 3: Position the audio

Use the “Move” tool to position your audio the way you’d like it to sound. You may need to delete audio from one or more clips to make it fit properly. The move tool is pictured here:



Audio that has been moved into position will look a bit like this; in this case, the footsteps can be heard under the main audio track (“What infidel has stolen my cactus?!”) rather than after the speaking has completed.



Step 4: Check your work!

Replay your audio from start to finish to be sure you’ve obtained the sound you hoped for!
